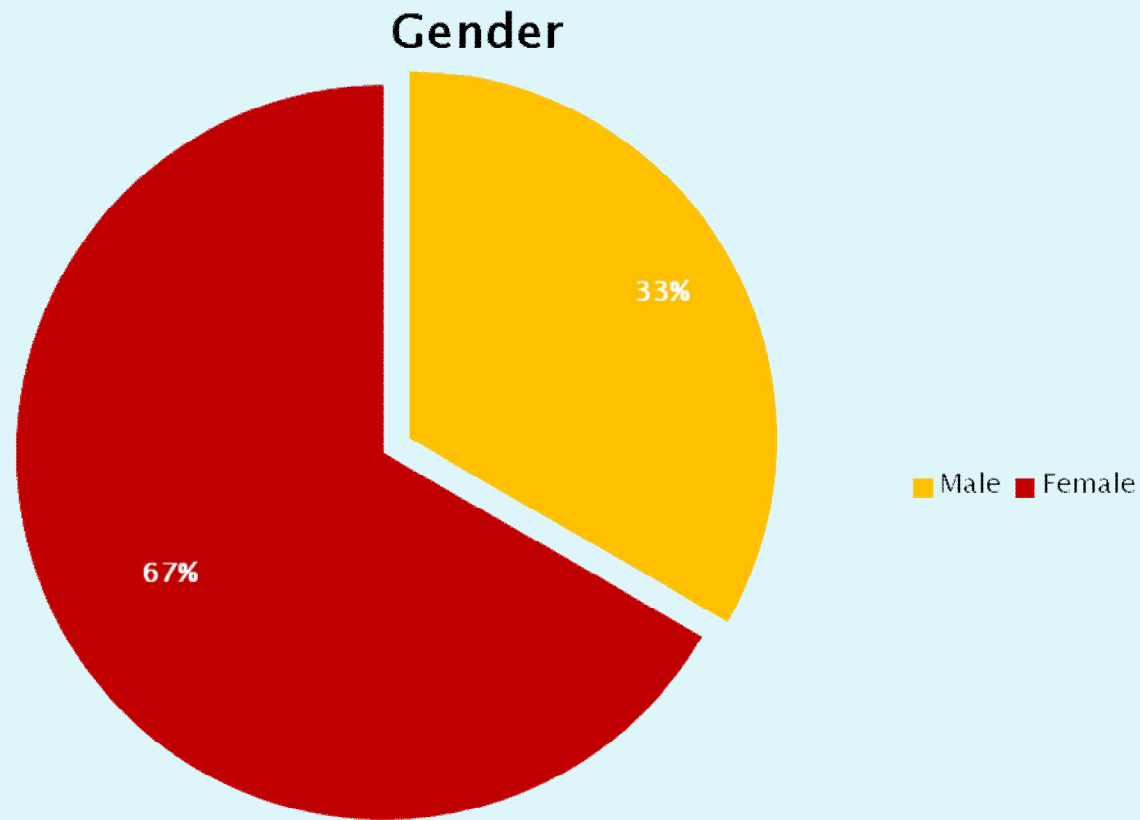




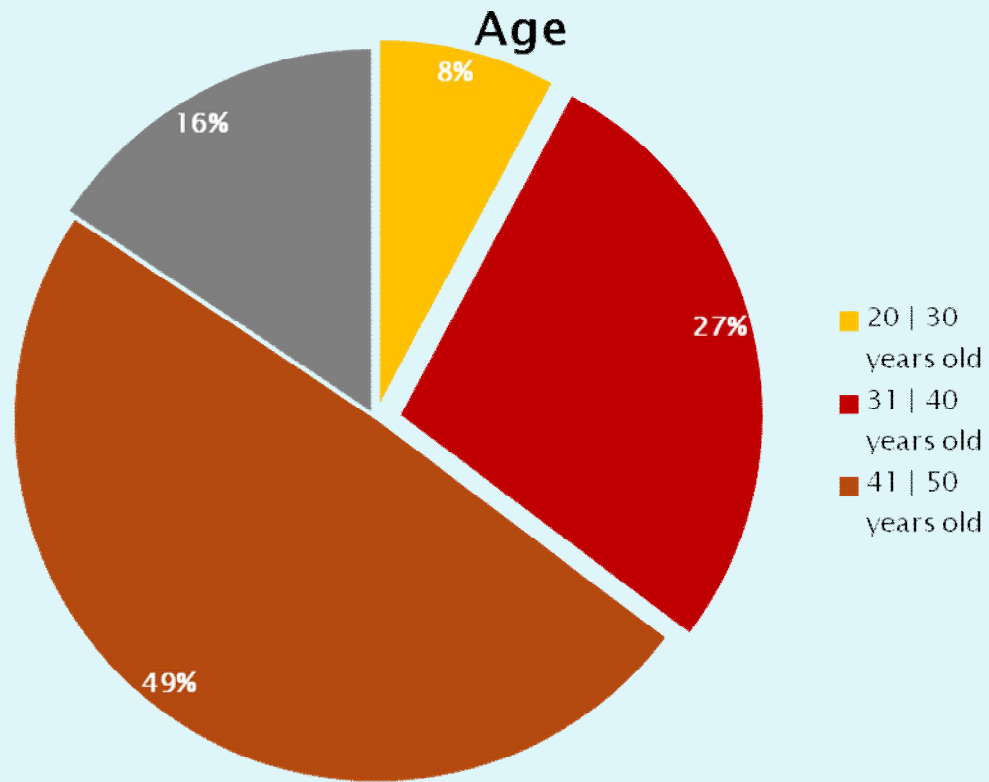
# A QUESTIONNAIRE ABOUT MOTIVATION FOR TEACHING AND TEACHING STRATEGIES

SEPTEMBER 2013

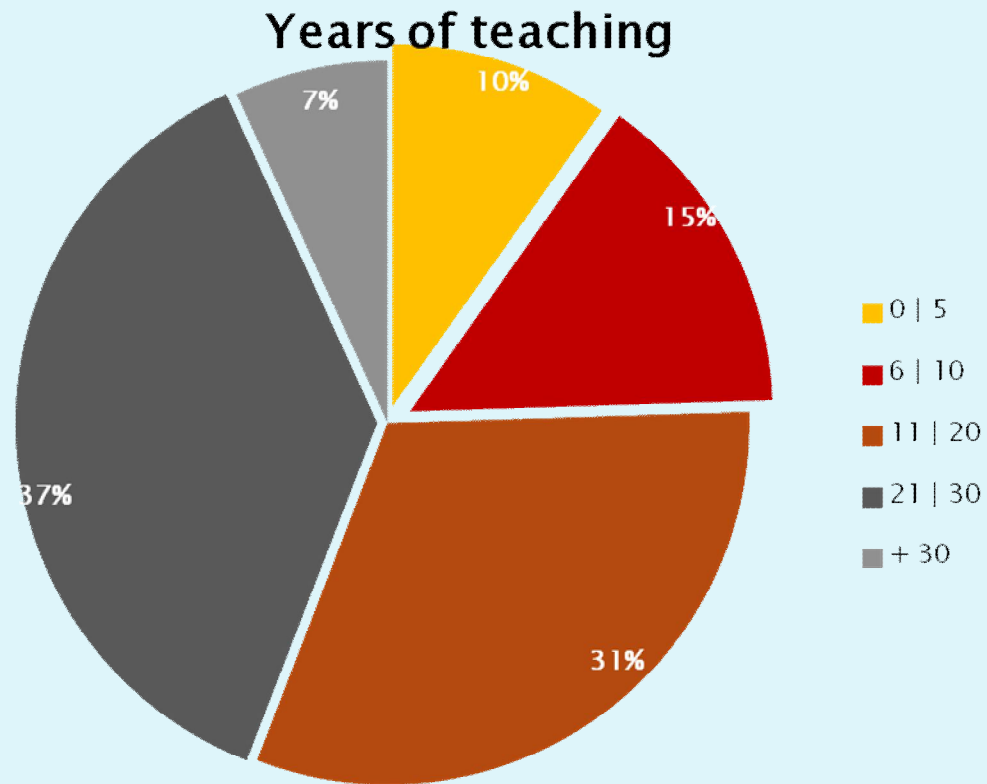
TunY: We are Y'ers  
*a tuning challenge for teachers*



Most of the teachers who took part in the questionnaire were female.



The most numerous age group were teachers between 41 and 50 years old.



The largest group taking part in the study were experienced teachers, with the history of 11 up to 30 years of teaching practice.

According to the teachers, the most important aspects of their work are the following:

- ▶ The relationship with students – 97%
- ▶ Giving clear instructions for tasks – 97 %
- ▶ The relationship with colleagues – 93 %
- ▶ Encouraging students to give suggestions to increase their interest – 89 %
- ▶ Active teaching – 88 %
- ▶ Simulating authentic situations to prepare students for real life – 84%
- ▶ Using humour in classroom – 82 %
- ▶ Working independently and use initiative – 80 %

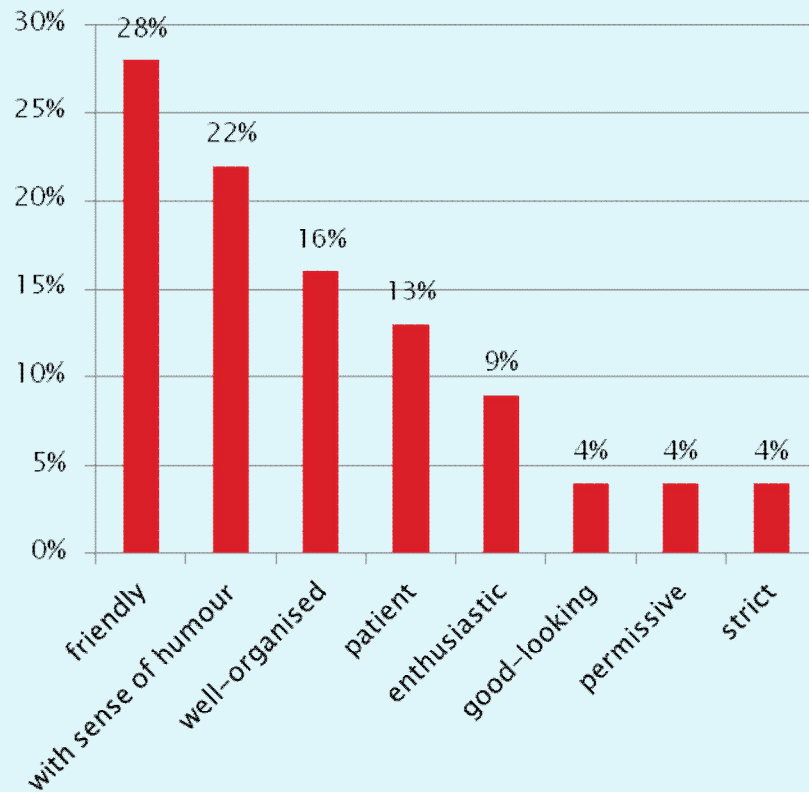
## Other quite important aspects are:

- ▶ Explaining the importance of the subject for students' further studies – 79 %
- ▶ Working with the whole class – 76 %
- ▶ Having a challenging job – 75 %
- ▶ Being able to work in a team – 74 %
- ▶ Participating in extra-curricular activities – 73%
- ▶ Student-centered tasks and lessons – 73 %
- ▶ Using ICT in lessons – 71 %
- ▶ Students' homework 71 %
- ▶ Matching the tasks to the students' needs rather than their exam requirements – 71 %

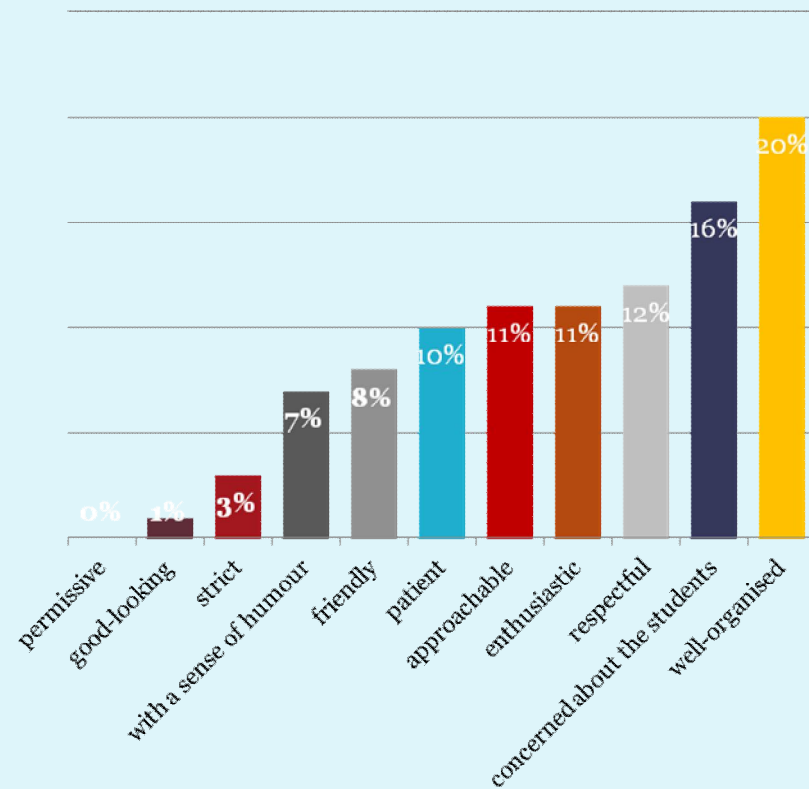
## The least important aspects are:

- ▶ Using social networks to work and communicate with students – not important for 51%
- ▶ Traditional lessons – not important for 33%
- ▶ Open-air activities – not important for 32%
- ▶ Having reduced number of lessons – not important for 18%
- ▶ Using ICT to communicate with students and colleagues – not important for 17%
- ▶ Using games and competitions, organising the class in pairs and organising the class in groups – not important for 15%
