



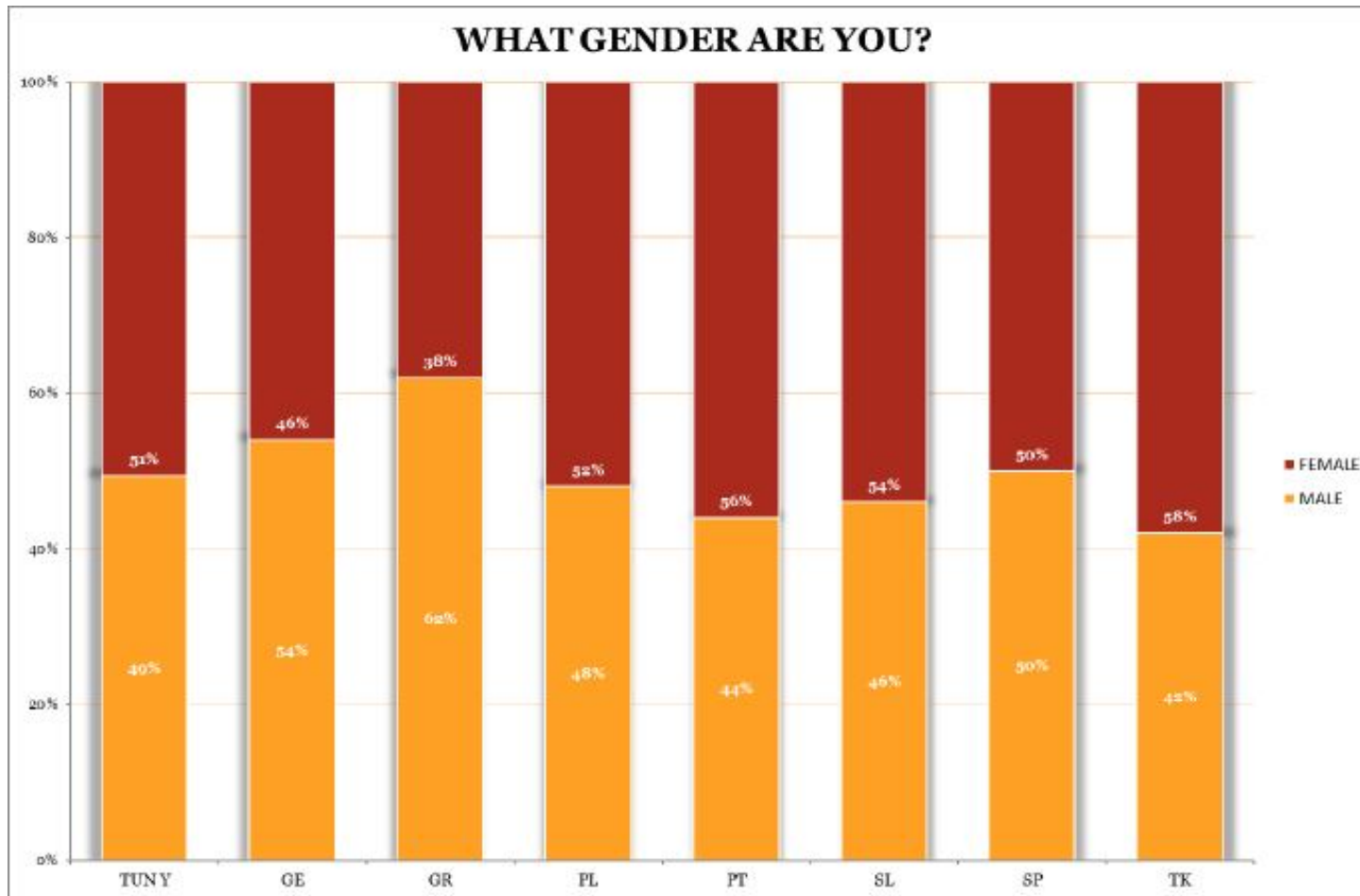

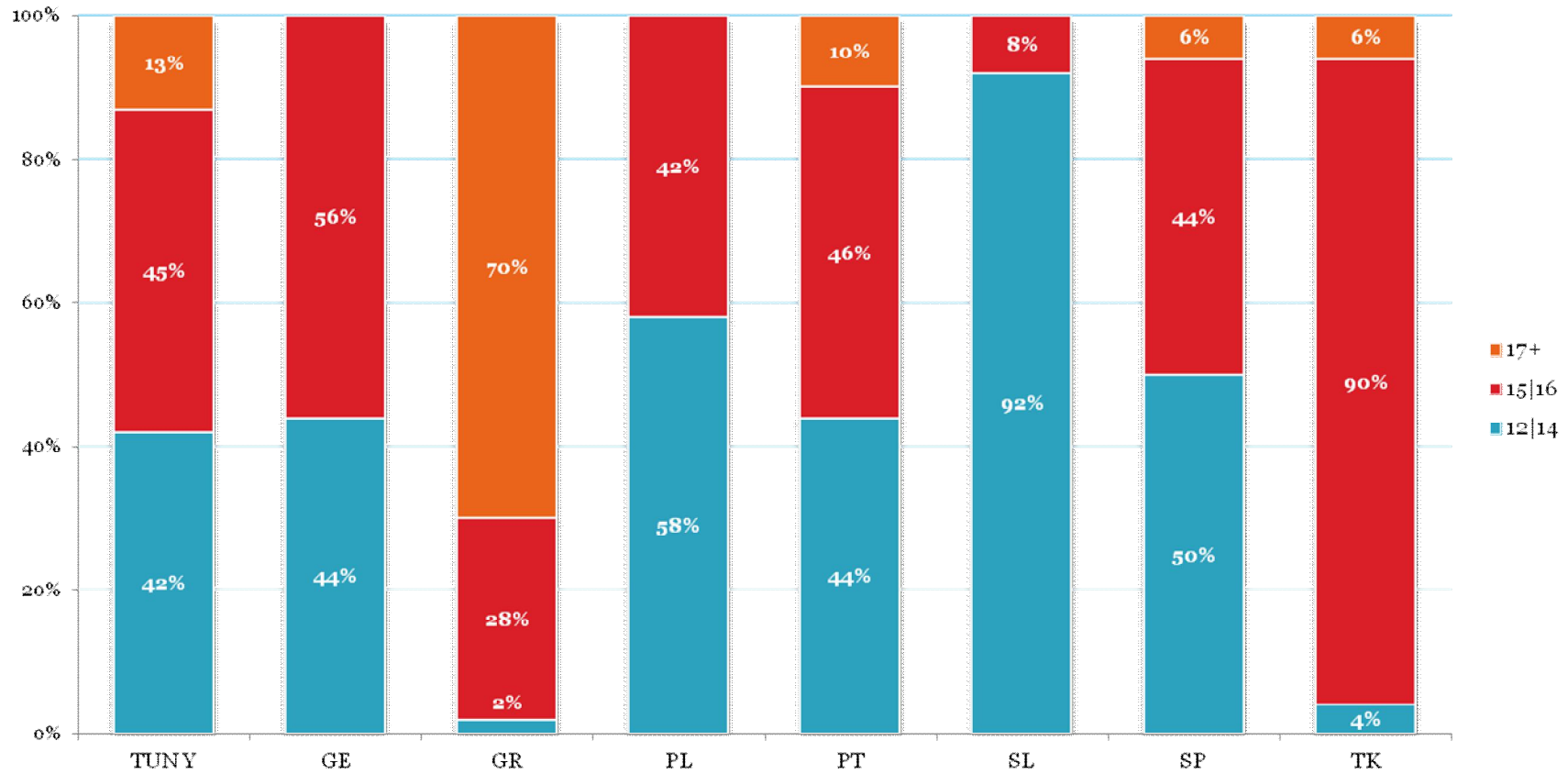
TunY: We are Y'ers

Slightly more female students took part in the study.

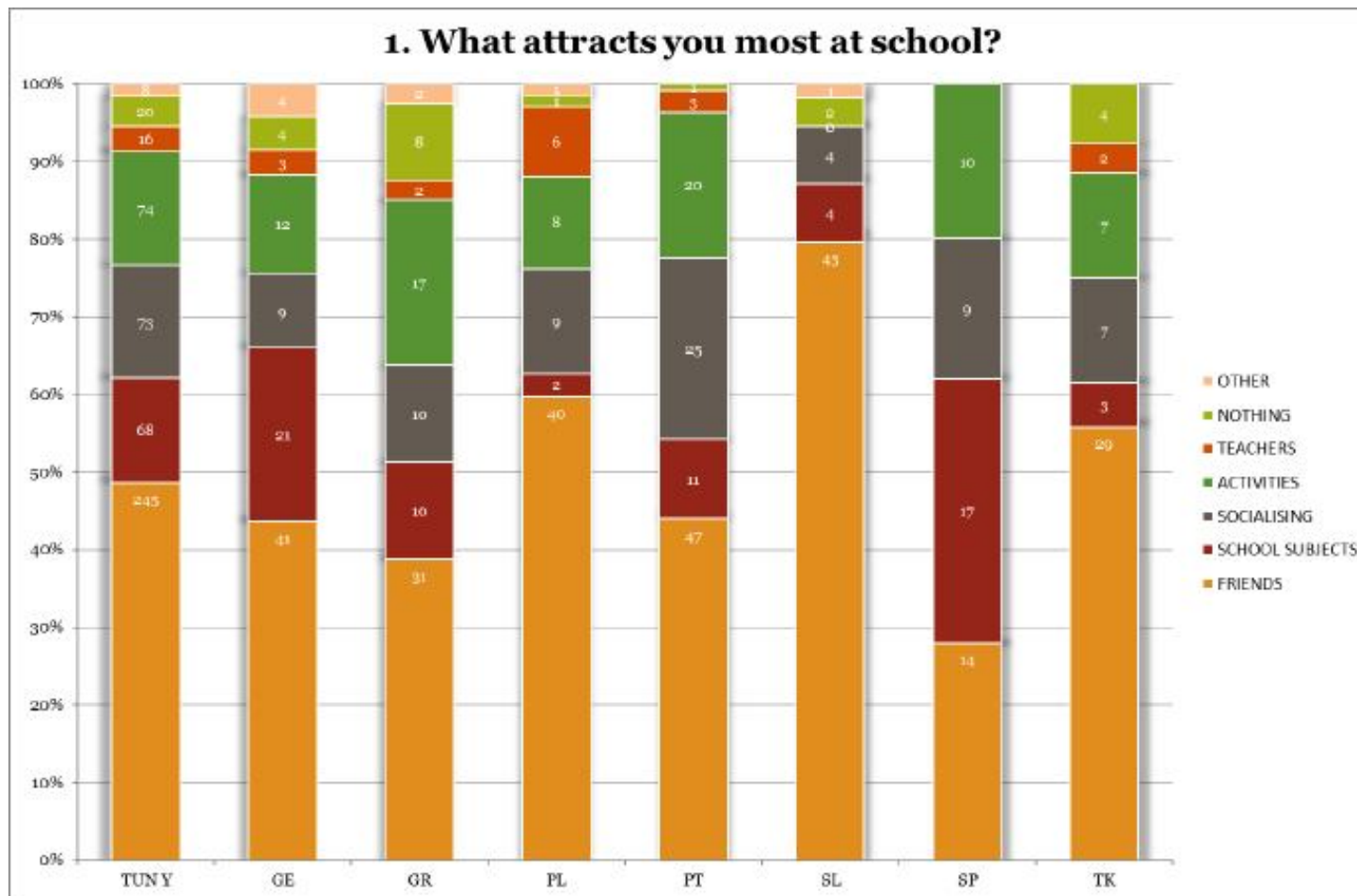


Slovenian students were the youngest and the Greek were the oldest.

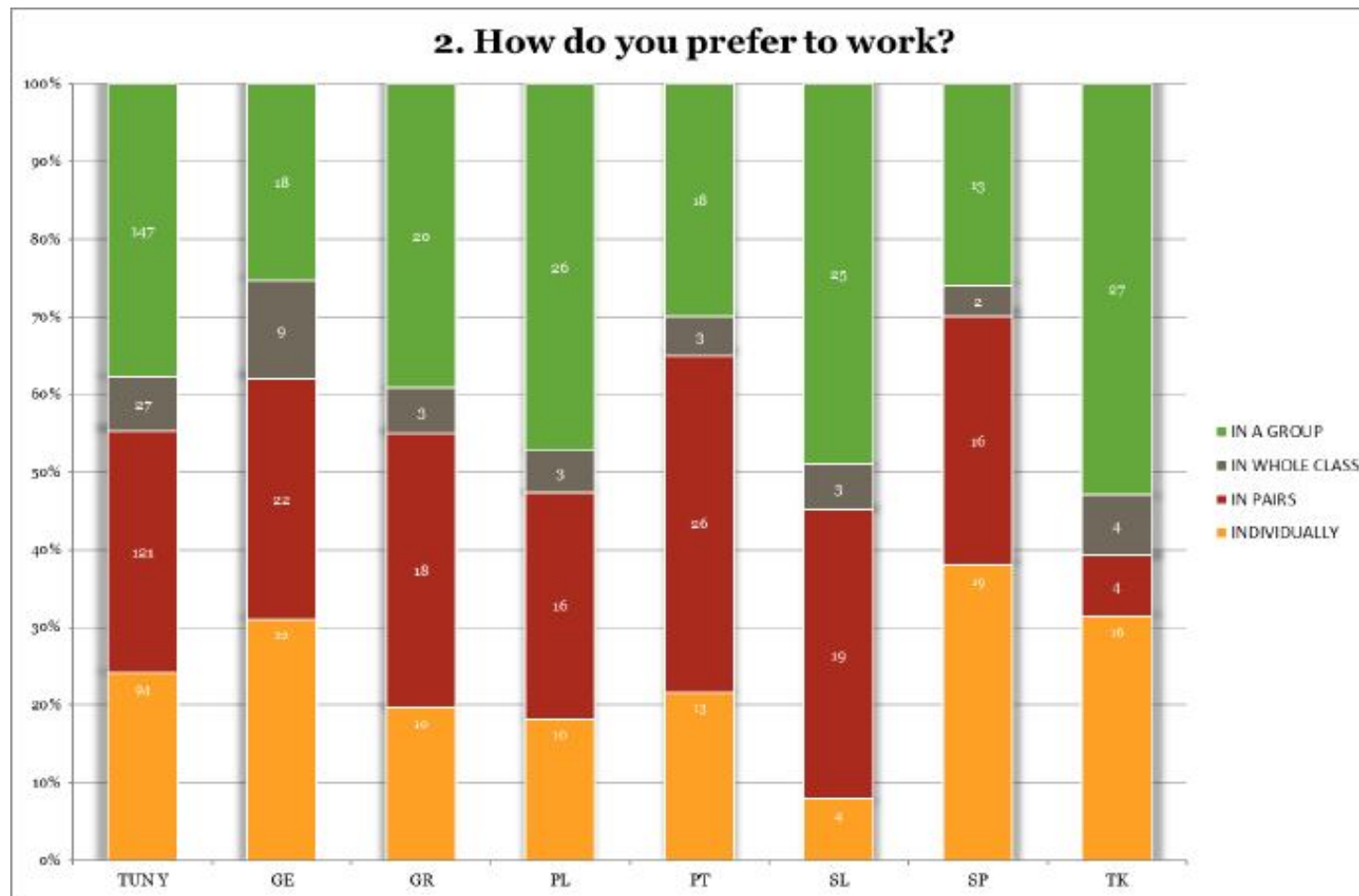
HOW OLD ARE YOU?



For the majority of our students, the reason why the school is attractive are friends. This is mostly visible in the case of Slovene students. Other often mentioned reasons were subjects (Spain), socialising (Portugal) and activities (Portugal, Greece and Spain).

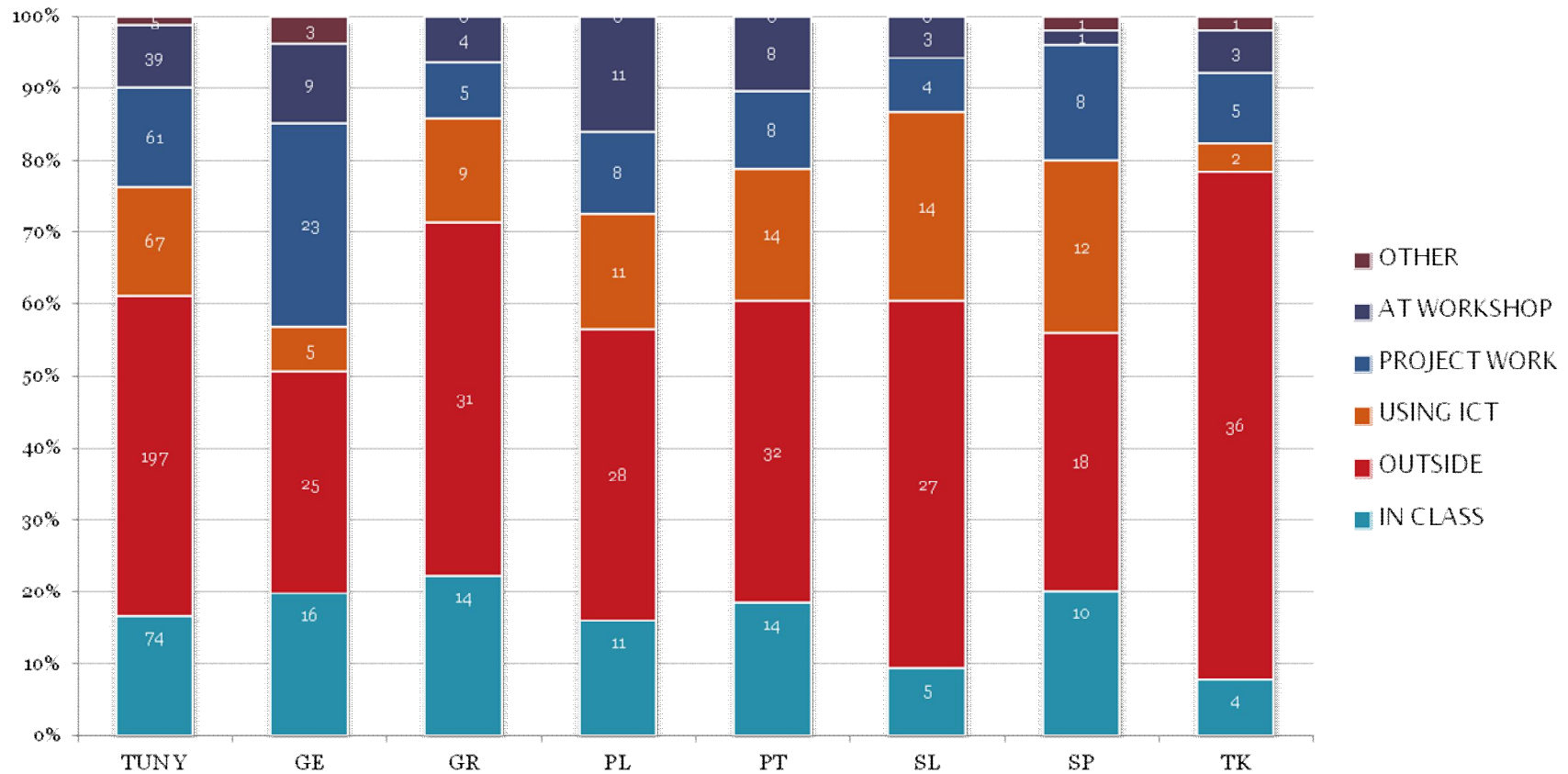


Students who took part in the study prefer to work in groups and in pairs. Some feel best working individually, but activities done as a whole class are clearly least popular regardless the nationality.

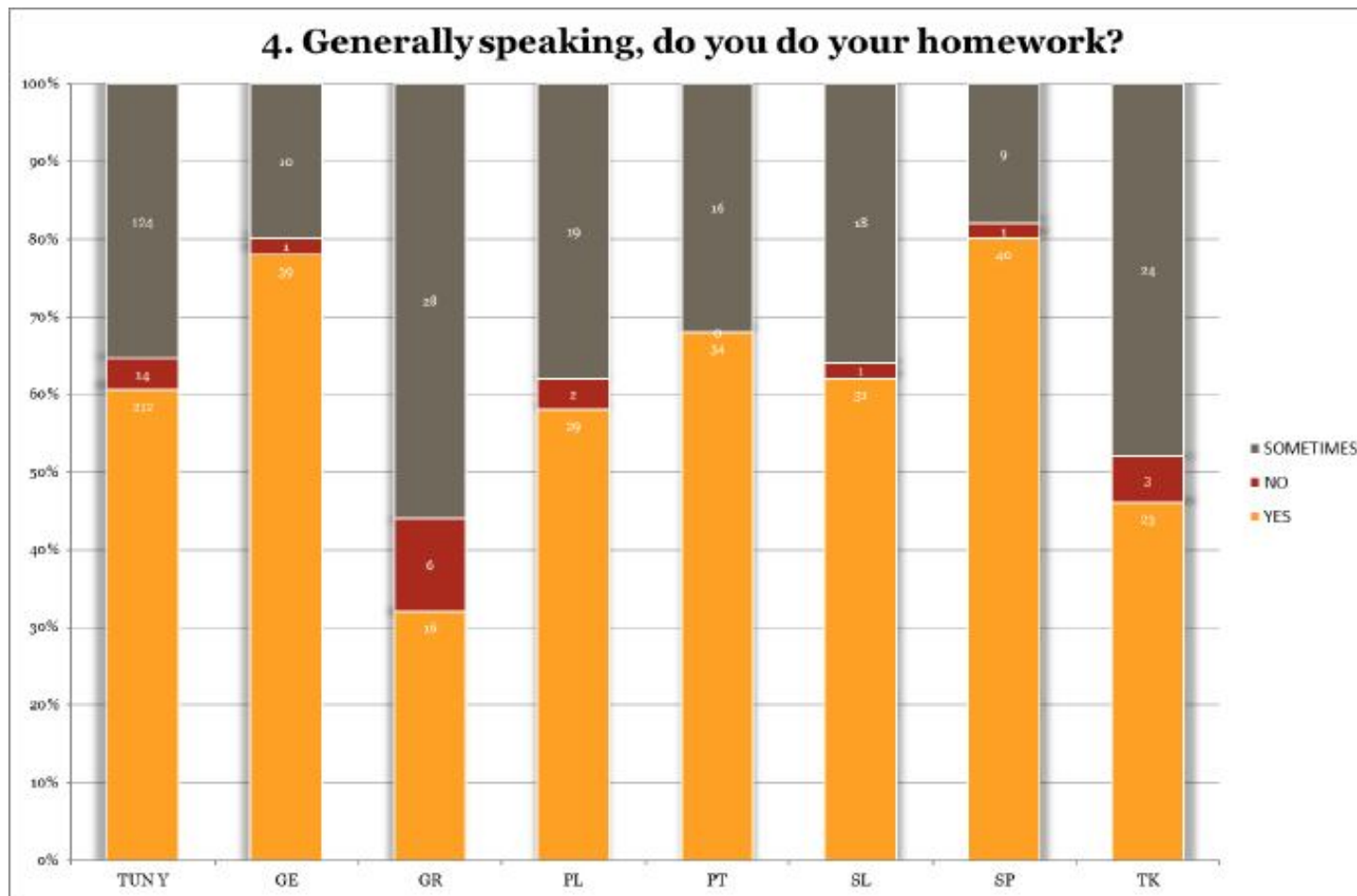


Clearly, students prefer activities performed outside the classroom. German students appreciate projects, Slovenian and Portuguese like using ICT. However, working in class also seems to be appreciated.

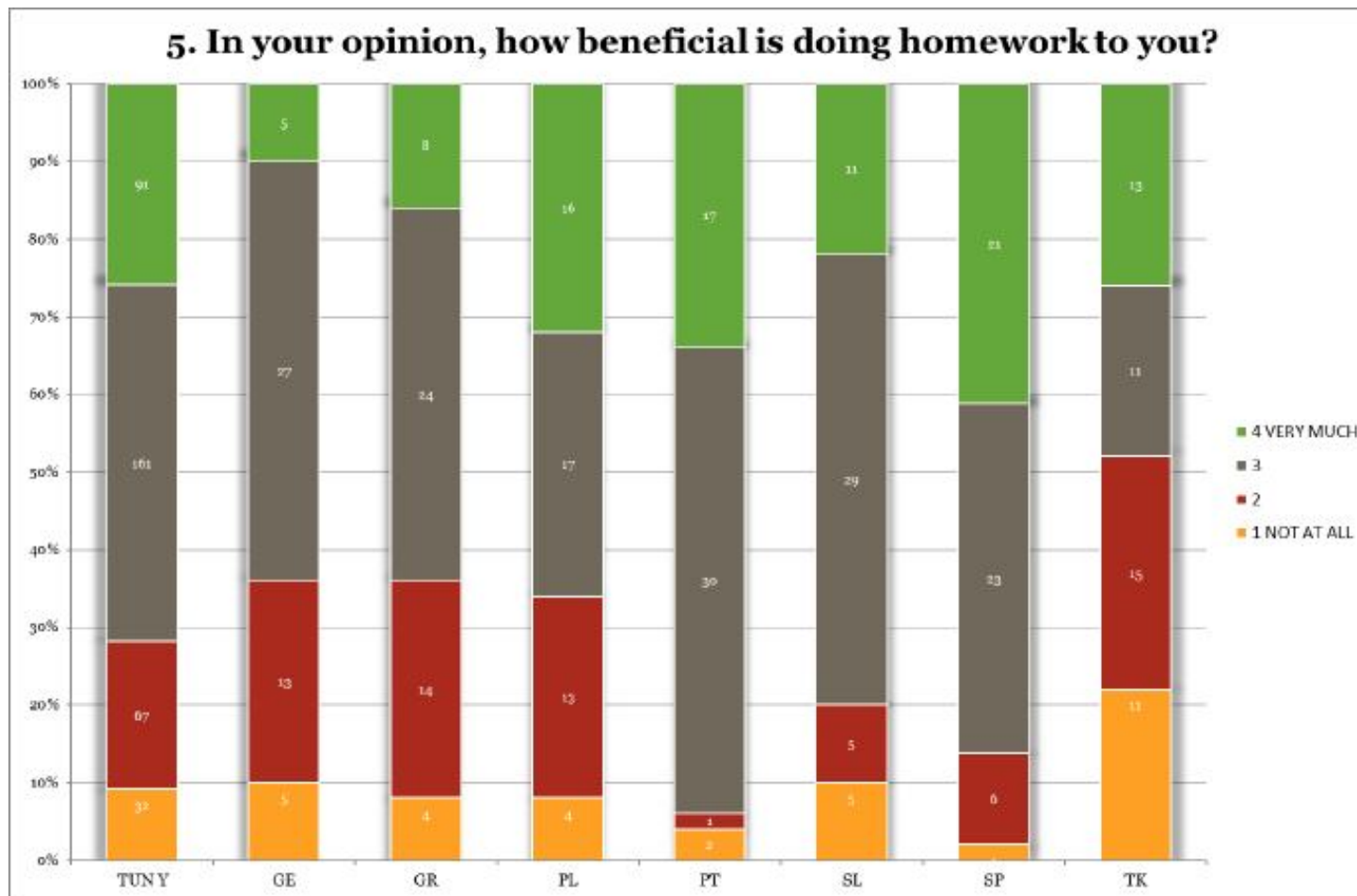
3. What kind of activities do you prefer?



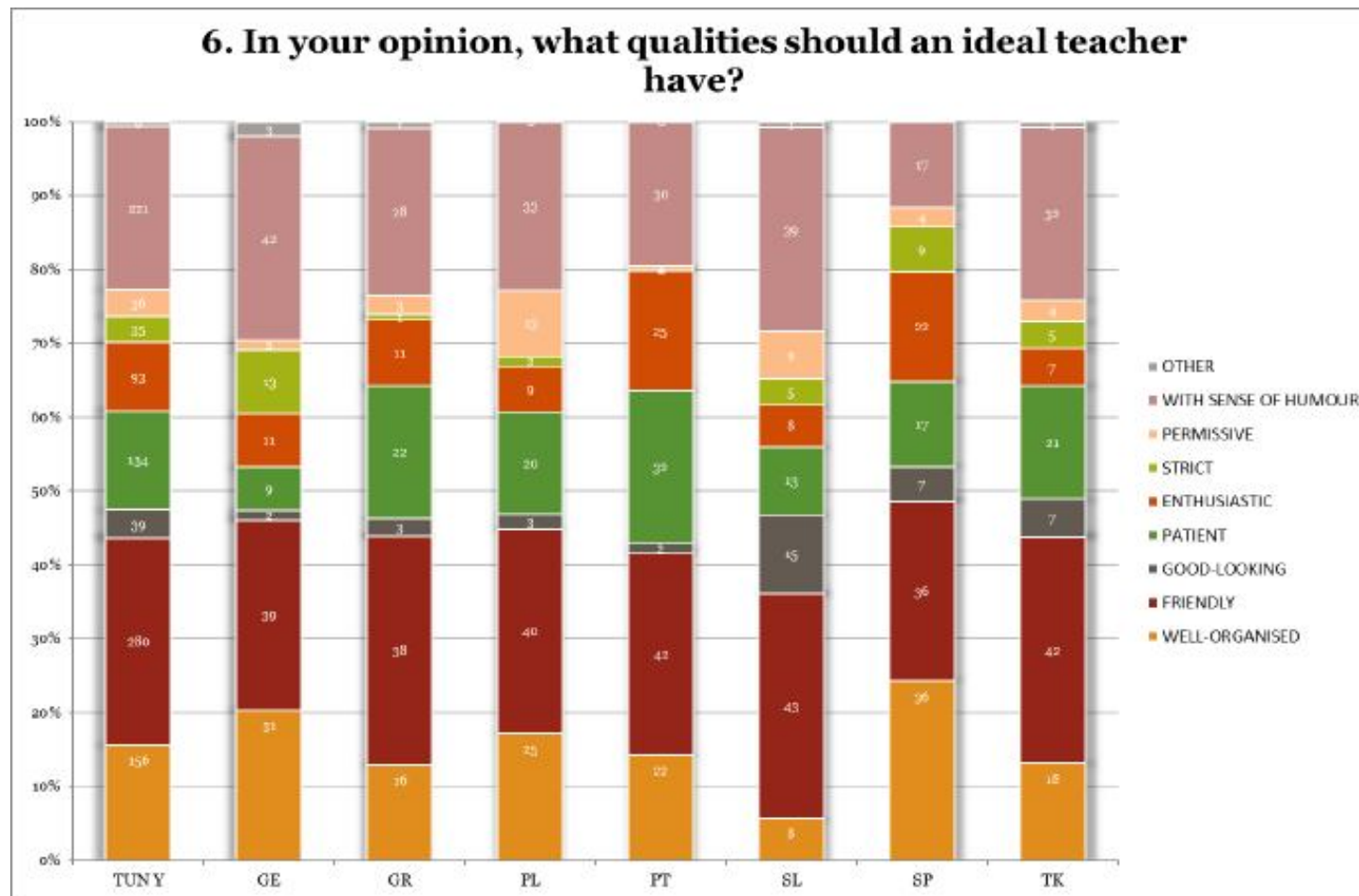
Only 14 of those questioned do not do their homework. Neither of them is Portuguese, and the majority comes from Greece.



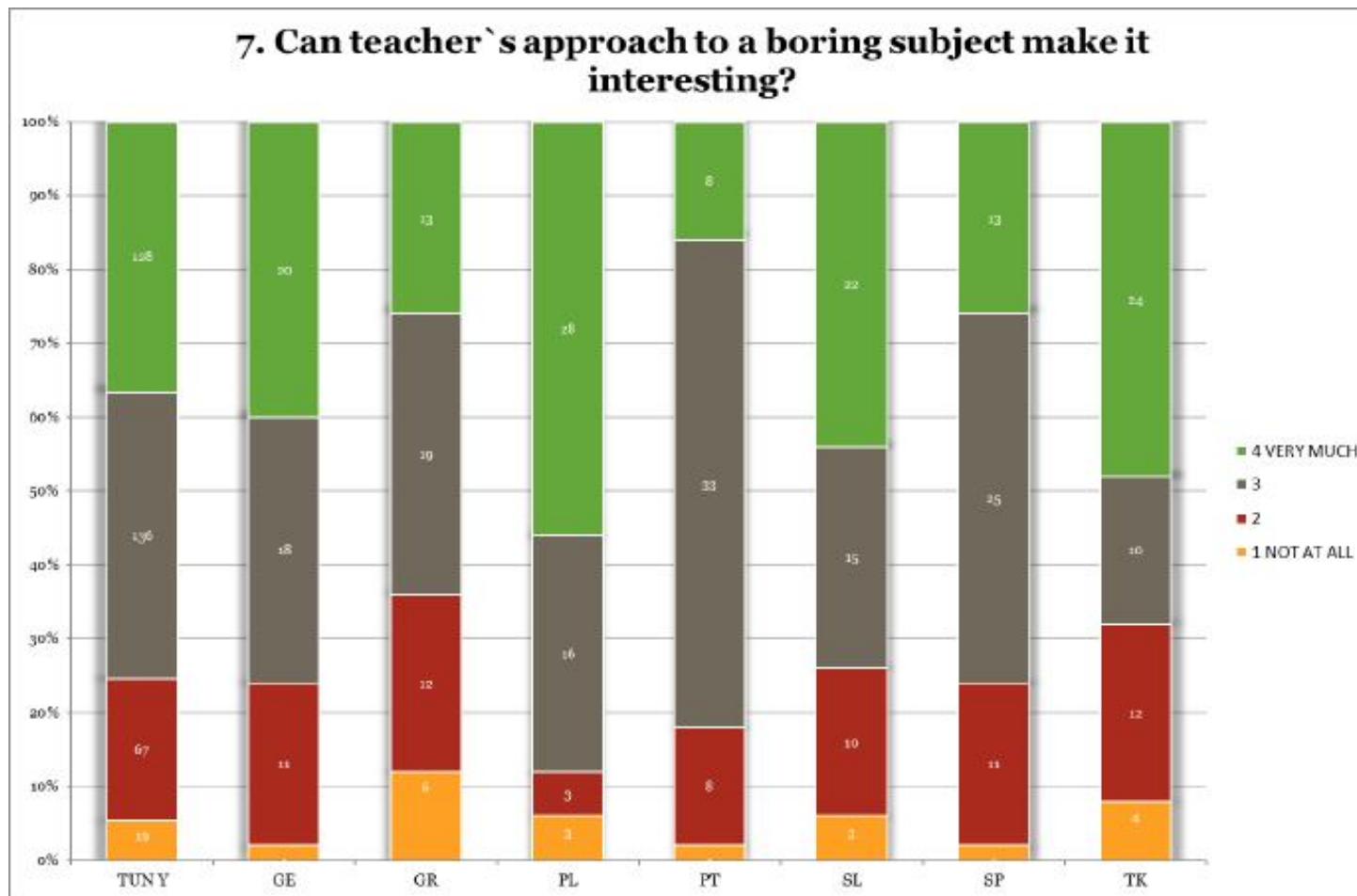
For the majority of students doing homework is quite (Portugal, Germany) or very beneficial (Spain). Turkish students find doing homework least useful.



An ideal teacher should be friendly and with the sense of humour, and preferably patient and well-organized. Portuguese and Spanish students also appreciate enthusiasm in their teachers. The qualities that were mentioned rarely were good-looking, strict and permissive.

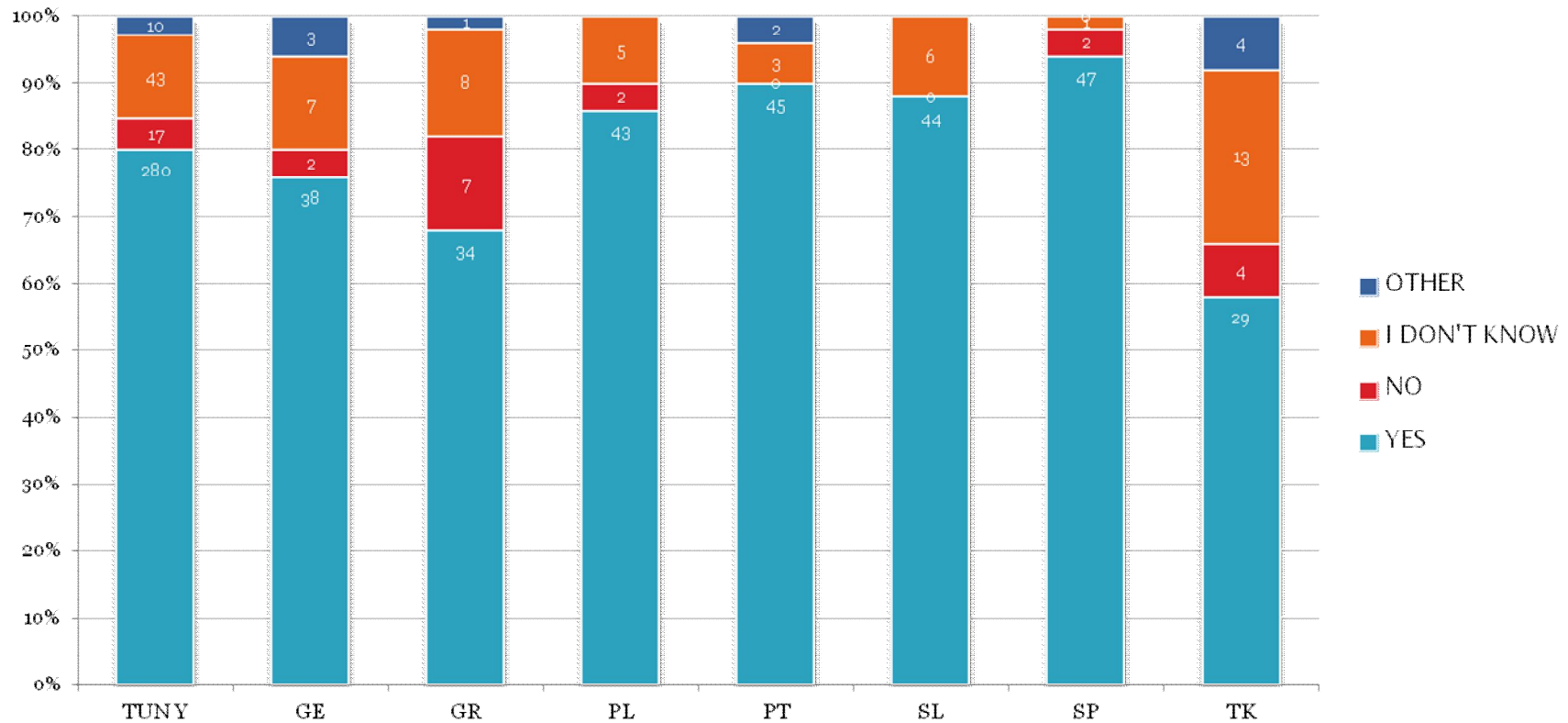


According to our students, teachers' role in making a boring subject more interesting is crucial. Only 6% are of the opinion that it is not possible.



80% believe that studying will help them succeed in life. Turkish and Greek students are least positive about that.
